3.1. NCODA (K. Bishop)

We hope all is well at University of British Columbia!

I am Rebecca Corvese, pharmacist at the National Community Oncology Dispensing Association (NCODA), an oncology pharmacy non-profit organization in New York. My colleague, Stephen Ziter, and I have been working with CAPSI leadership to provide information about NCODA to all pharmacy schools in Canada

NCODA has been collaborating with pharmacy students at the University of Montreal to provide additional pharmacy education, at no cost to the students!

NCODA offers Student Educational Talks (SETs) in which Pharmacists create mini lectures covering oncology topics only overviewed in class. Pharmacy students also contribute presentations, and discuss disease states and therapies (great way to get national presentation experience!).

NCODA also offers an Oncology Leadership Series (OLS), in which senior oncology clinical and industry professionals discuss their 3.1.1. career path from school to their current positions.

- 3.2. By-Elections (K. Bishop)
